Detective Inspector Brian Halligan Garda National Cyber Crime Bureau

Brian Halligan has 21 years' service as a member of An Garda Síochána. Brian was appointed to the Garda National Cyber Crime Bureau in November 2019 as Inspector with responsibility for Operations in the Bureau. This includes leading An Garda Síochána response in areas such as the prevention, detection, investigation and prosecution of cybercrime incidents in the State. Brian is experienced in leading expert investigators to proactively identify and prosecute cyber-criminals operating in Ireland and in international jurisdictions. This involves close cooperation and liaison with Interpol, Europol, the FBI and other international law enforcement agencies. Brian lectures on cybercrime subjects with the European Union Agency for Law Enforcement Training (CEPOL) and holds an MSc in Forensic Computing and Cyber Crime Investigation from UCD, a BA in Criminal Justice from UL and a BA in Public Management from the NCA.
